# COMMENTS DUE 11/6 ON PROPOSED FEDERAL NURSING HOME STAFFING **REGULATIONS. RAISE YOUR VOICE, TELL YOUR STORY!**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released a proposed rule establishing a minimum staffing standard in nursing homes that is less than research finds equals quality of care. It does not go far enough to protect nursing home residents.

It is important that CMS hears from YOU that this rule needs to be stronger, implemented quicker and stop facilities from getting a waiver from compliance.

There are some positives in the proposal, including requiring every nursing home to have a registered nurse on staff twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week, updated requirements on facility assessments, and provisions on how Medicaid dollars are spent on nursing home care.

If you have had experience yourself or as a caregiver or visitor, now is the time to tell your story about the need for better staffing levels than in the proposal. We must insist on 4.1 hours of care per day, with .75 of those hours provided by an RN, the amount and type of care that research finds makes the difference.
